Two Gulbransen Rialto Organs Looking for a Home

The grandson of the late Emil Martin has decided to dispose of Emil's two Gulbransen Rialto organs. He will give them with no qualifications to anyplace or anyone that will provide at least some assurance that they will have a good home and will be played and heard. It could be a private home or anywhere, They are identical except for color of the wood finish.

The Gulbransen Rialto was considered one of the most desirable electronic organs of the 60's and 70's. While they were designed to look and play somewhat like a theatre organ, in fact much like the Hammond, the Rialto



almost became a musical idiom on its own, not necessarily with close reference to the pipe organ. While not as widely used professionally as the Hammond, the Rialto was often heard in lounges and restaurants of the midcentury. Our own member, the late Bud Taylor, played on one for many years in a



very nice restaurant in L.A. and George Wright is pictured using one for his scoring of TV's General Hospital.

A broad, mellow sound best describes the Rialto largely due to the big four channel Leslie speaker designed specifically for this organ. The Leslie speaker with each of these organs is a necessary part of accepting one because there are no speakers in the console. As with any complex electronic, mechanical device that is 50 or more years old, there may be functional issues as in dead notes etc.. Functionality is currently being assessed. Emil's grandson will run through the keys and stops. The organs are located in Pollock Pines. Contact Randy Warwick for additional information. Article Contributed by Randy Warwick

He got his start before World War II with KFBK Sacramento radio as a studio organist and musical director in the days of studio orchestras. He returned to McClatchy in 1946 when the program department was established.
