

Musical Director, Performer, and Accompanist



Jim was honored to be Music Director at the Birthday Extravaganza for Denny Mangers and Mayor Darrel Steinberg. Jim has served as Music

Director at the former Garbeau's Dinner Theatre in Sacramento, the Woodland Opera House, Eldorado Musical Theatre in El Dorado Hills, The Elly Awards, Sacramento, City Lights Dinner Theatre, Fort Wavne, Indiana, and others.

Jim has provided music for three recent films: The Sacramento Picture, Behind Your Radio Dial and Alhambra: Sacramento's Palace of Fantasy, all directed by Jim's dear friend, Matias Antonio Bombal. But his greatest joys have come from being Music Director for 16 years for the late Queen of Cabaret, Miss Gaviel Von.

Jim has been playing the piano for 60 years, a

church organist for 54 years and has been a full-time professional musician since the age of 22.

Jim's "day job" is being the Minister of Music & Media at Pioneer Congregational United Church of Christ where he has built one of the area's finest music programs. He has developed the sellout Holiday concert, "Songs of the Season", the moving Good Friday work "Season of Love" and six years ago began the monthly concert series "Performances at Pioneer" showcasing the area's finest talent in one of the most beautiful performance venues in all of California.

One of Jim's most fun events is the annual SPOOKtacular. A large screen is put up in Pioneer Church and Jim improvises to the silent classic Lon Chaney's Phantom of The Opera complete with introductions and a short history by the one and only Matias Bom-

Jim recorded the music for Matias Bombal's Hollywood on this very instrument and is delighted to be playing it again today.

If you have not yet attended one of our events at the home of Wendell Jacob, here is another chance

Wendell has built a large music room on his property to house his collection of musical instruments, including a Calliope, a Merry-go-round band organ, a Honky-tonk piano, and numerous electronic organs. Of course, the centerpiece of the room is the restored 3/14 Moller Pipe Organ from the Lobby of the former San Francisco Fox Theatre.

Free Bourdon Rank and Chest

Sierra Member Bill Trabucco (530) 273-4252 from near Grass Valley reports the following:

I have a beautiful, redwood 16' bourdon the bottom octave (12) that's been sitting in my barn ever since we moved up here. CCC is 9" wide, straight, not arched, upper lips. As they are heart redwood, I'm guessing they might either be Wurlitzer or Murray Harris since both used redwood. The leather and padding on the stoppers is, of course, shot but otherwise the pipes are in good condition. They're free to anyone who wants them. My little pipe organ already has four 16' ranks so there's no point in adding any more to the bottom, particularly as my 16' open wood is a belly rattler. I also have two pedal offset chests, covering 27 pipes from 16'.
