Mark Herman at Hunter Hall 218 California St., Rio Vista Sunday, May 18th 2:00 PM

Sterra Chapter welcomes Mark Herman back to the valley! We have enjoyed previous performances at our George Wright Memorial concert in 2008 and Morton Madness in 2009. He has also performed several concerts at the Berkeley Community Theatre. This will be a great opportunity to hear him on the Hunter Hall Wurlitzer. Previously installed at Uncle Milt's Pizza Company in Vancouver Washington, this is a great sounding instrument in a room that perfectly fits the sound.

This is one of those do-not-miss events!





Born in 1987, **Mark Herman** is one of America's busiest young theatre organists, performing over 30 concerts and silent film presentations each year across the US and abroad. In July of 2012, he was named the American Theatre Organ Society's Organist of the Year and is the youngest person ever to receive the prestigious honor!

He studied theatre organ with John Ferguson of Indianapolis, who is recognized worldwide for his skills as a teacher. His classical piano studies were with Christine Freeman. After graduating with a degree in Theatre Arts/Management from DePaul University in Chicago, Mark relocated to Indianapolis, where he operates Mark Herman Design LLC, a web and marketing company specializing in web design, video, and marketing. He also represents the Allen Organ Company for the Meridian Music. In addition, he is in demand as a voicing specialist and tonal consultant for Allen Organs and is proud to be an Allen Artist, showcasing

new Allen Organs in the United States and beyond.

**Directions:** Take I-5 towards Lodi and exit at Hwy 12 West towards Rio Vista. When you cross over the Rio Vista Bridge (the big drawbridge) take the first off ramp, keep to the right and go under the bridge and head south (along the river on Front Street). You will come to a 4-way stop sign (Main St.). Keep going south two more blocks to California Street, turn right and go one block. The Hall is on the right, at the corner of California and Second Street. Hunter Hall is the L shaped building. Parking is on the street. Allow about 1.1/2 hr. from the Sacramento area.

**Scenic Route:** Take I-5 towards Lodi and exit at Twin Cities Road (west). Drive past the TV towers, and turn left (south) onto Hwy 160 (River Road). Continue on Hwy 160 to Hwy 12 and turn right onto the Rio Vista Bridge, then follow directions above.

Adventure Route: Take Hwy 50/I-80 to West Sacramento and exit at Jefferson Blvd. Continue south on Jefferson Blvd (Hwy 84) to Courtland Rd and turn right. Then a left onto Ryer Ave and continue a few miles on the delta levies. Then right onto the Ryer Island Ferry. (Note - Ferry is free, but does not run at lunchtime (Noon -1:00pm) Exit Ferry and turn left onto River Rd. Turn left on Front Street, and follow directions above.

## CD Review - Red Wing Ragtime And Marches

Piano-centric Ragtime music gets a welcome change-up with **Bill Coale's** new CD— **Red Wing Ragtime and Marches**. Performed on a theater organ, Bill has taken advantage of all the rich, colorful sounds and majesty inherent in the instrument to present a very fine CD.

Taking a listen to some of the Joplin rags performed (**Palm Leaf**, **Original Rags** and **Chrysanthemum**) one gets a sampling of the various stop registrations that give each piece its own very distinct flavor.


Sprinkled between the many ragtime solos that include **Chili-Sauce Rag** (H.A. Fischler), **Whistling Rufus** (Kerry Mills), **Temptation Rag** (Henry Lodge), **Black and White Rag** (George Botsford) and others are the spirited marches of Kerry Mills, and John Philip Sousa, which include use of the organ's tuned and non-tuned percussions. A few delightful numbers

not programmed very often are Victor Herbert's Al Fresco and Sparkling by Mindle Cere. The Midnight Fire Alarm by Harry J. Lincoln makes use of some spiffy sounds from the organ's "toy counter." Vocals by Bill on Joplin's Sarah Dear and distant 1920s relative Jack Coale's I'm All Alone are also included.

Bill Coale's first CD is very entertaining. It's lively! It's fun and would make a nice addition to your Ragtime collection.
