

Dan Bellomy (1951 - 2008)

On August 29th of 2008, Dan left this world to play the Mighty Theatre Organ in the sky. We who are left behind will miss him much. The Theatre Pipe Organ community is now less one more highly talented player and enthusiast, who will be remembered as one of the greats. He was a favorite of your Spiel editor. I first heard him at the Warnors Theatre in Fresno, back in 1994 and was blown away. His deep knowledge of the nuts and bolts of musical structure helped make him a master of improvised chord progression.

Stan Kann (1924 - 2008)

St. Louis (KMOX) -- St. Louis personality Stan Kann has died. Well known for his organ playing at the Fox Theatre, Stan was still performing at the age of 83. He appeared on The Tonight Show 77 times and often was the center of jokes for his vacuum cleaner collection. Kann died at St. Louis University Hospital. Friends said he was being admitted for breathing difficulties and fell from a gurney while being transported into the hospital. He suffered head injuries and later died

from complications during a cardiac catheterization.
