movie accompaniment, solo music of the 1920's-1950's, and jazz organ.

Over the past 30 years, he has played in many of the great remaining vin-

tage theatres and organ restaurants like the *Pizza and Pipes* in both Sacramento and Fresno. He's also our local Technician to many of the valley organs.

His style at the console is as uniquely his own as is his fashionable appearance. Moreno is an avid collector of vintage platform shoes; his collection is currently over 600 pairs! You'll likely see his favorite pair of the day, busy on the organ's pedal board during his performance.


"THE SKELETON DANCE" (1929) Cartoon The clock strikes midnight, the bats fly from the belfry, a dog howls at the full moon, plus two black cats fight in the cemetery, A perfect time for the skeletons to come out and dance a bit!

"HAUNTED HOUSE" (1921) Buster Keaton Buster is a bank teller who becomes involved in a hold-up, counterfeiters and ends up in a seemingly haunted house that is actually a thieves hideout.



"HAUNTED SPOOKS" (1920) Harold Lloyd

After numerous failed attempts to to commit suicide, Harold runs into a lawyer who is looking for a stooge to stand in as a groom in order to secure an inheritance for his client. The inheritance is a house, which her scheming uncle "haunts" so that he can scare them off and claim the property.





While having to cancel this year's George Wright Tribute Concert was a disappointment, we can look forward to seeing the Grant Auditorium in better condition than in at least a couple of decades

when the renovation is completed. In fact, it may be better than not only when we started the GW series many years ago but probably even better than in the mid-60's when the Chapter first started using the Grant organ then played by George Seaver for silent movie presentations.

Speaking of organ presentations, I would like to thank **Dave Moreno** for contributing time and effort to presenting and playing the Chapter organ for the Fair Oaks Park Chicken Festival on Saturday, September 19. Over the two hours from 1 to 3 p.m., there were always between five to twenty people, spending ten minutes to over half an hour with the Wurlitzer. A realistic estimate would be about 70 to 80 people total. All were new to the organ except for members **Harold and Patty Schneringer**, who showed up all the way from Benicia, and former Wurlitzer electronic organ Western States sales manager **Gus Pearson**, who stopped by but left before we had a chance to shuttle him up to the console.
