Bert Kuntz is a very popular Sacramento theatre organist and he always thrills the audience with his "big band" arrangements. He is a member of the American Theatre Organ Society and a former staff organist at the old Arden Pizza & Pipes.

Admission for this event will be \$10.

Bert's last Sacramento appearance in concert was at the California Auto Museum in 2008. After moving to Quincy, Illinois, that same year to be closer to his two sons, he hadn't performed at all in the first five years there until he attended an organ concert in St. Louis. After the concert they announced open console, upon which he took his turn. He was then asked to do a concert a few months later at a home installation. A year later he performed a concert at the Party on the Pipes event for the St. Louis Chapter. Now other concerts are in the works for next year as well. "It's good to be back on the bench again", said Bert, "but now let's back up a bit." While living in Sacramento he was staff organist for Pizza and Pipes for about six years until it closed. Also he has performed many concerts at various venues including Grant Union High School, The Stockton Fox, California Auto Museum, Ironstone Vineyards, Harmony Vineyards and the Fair Oaks Community Clubhouse. He looks forward to coming back to Sacramento to perform once again at Fair Oaks for the Sierra Chapter members, friends, and relatives.

PRESIDENT'S PERSPECTIVE—Randy Warwick



Many of us lament the lack of theatre organ music on broadcast radio or its availability in the few remaining record stores. Ah, for the days when even the major LP labels in the midfifties to late sixties were turn-

ing out theatre organ LP's. But in reality, there is truly a lot of recorded theatre organ music available whenever you want it. Unless you had a huge collection of LP's back then, there is more now and you can hear at any time of your choosing than, say 1962, during the "golden era" of theatre organ music high-fi.

Today there are several sources, starting with our own Chapter website where **Dave Sauer** has posted 136 sound files. Of course, you can still buy CD's. Then there is the 24-hour stream "Theatre Organ Radio" hosted on the ATOS website. Also, consider Steven Ashley's very fine "Hot Pipes" podcast service that gives you typically three to five, one-hour, themed podcasts a month for about \$3.40 a month. At a dollar or less per recorded hour, that beats the typical \$4.95 per 40-minute LP in the mid-sixties, not even adjusting for inflation!

Having worked in radio for many years, I admit to a curiosity of recent music; as a Spotify user, I put George Wright into the search box on their site and wow, over 30 albums, both LP and CD, popped up. Admittedly, his name yielded the most theatre organ music. I found five Jesse Crawfords, two Jelani Eddingtons, and one each of Dick Liebert and Buddy Cole. So all in all, there is a lot of recorded theatre organ music available, at any time of your choice, even if not on AM, FM, or in a record store.
