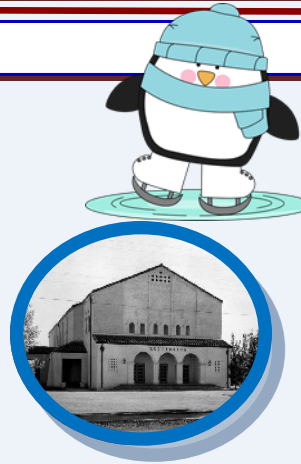

The four-manual twenty-one rank theatre pipe organ at Grant Union High School was installed over a period of one year from 1938 to 1939. Pipe work and chests were obtained from theatre organs in Redding and San Francisco, California, and Reno, Nevada. The best parts were used to assemble the organ by students under the direction of Fred Wood, an organ builder from Oakland. The new Grant organ was presented to the public in a recital by Howard Scott and George Wright on December 8, 1939. Recent improvements to the organ have been completed including a replacement Post horn more suitable to the size of the Grant auditorium.

Mark Herman is a distinguished American theatre organist who has performed hundreds of solo concerts and silent film presentations across the United States and internationally. He received the prestigious American Theatre Organ Society's Organist of the Year award in 2012, becoming the youngest recipient in the society's history.

Featured on American Public Media's Pipedreams and at conventions for various organ societies, Mark has toured internationally in Australia, New Zealand, Switzerland, and the UK. His work has been showcased on television and in films, including a notable 2019 organ cameo with the Los Angeles Philharmonic. Renowned for his period-authentic film scores, he composed and recorded new scores for The Criterion Collection's Harold Lloyd Blu-ray release in 2019.

Mark studied theatre organ with John Ferguson and classical piano with Christine Freeman. He holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre Arts/Management from DePaul University. Residing in Los Angeles, he is the President of [Herman Organ Company](#), leading a talented team in the museum-quality restoration and care of historic pipe organs.

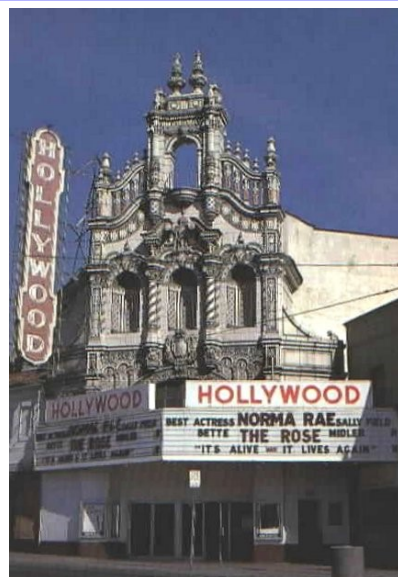

The history of Wurlitzer Opus 1327



Opus 1327 was originally installed in the Hollywood Theater in Portland Oregon in 1926 . It was a 3/10 Style H “special.”

In 1955, it was moved to the Imperial Ice Rink in Portland. As was typical for skating rink installations, all pipes, wind chests, percussions and traps were located in the rafters above the skating floor. For some reason, in the early 70’s, it went into storage and was supposedly owned by the McDonalds Restaurant chain.



In the late '70s, it was purchased by **Dr. John Dapolito and his wife Jane**



in La Mesa, California, (San Diego area) and installed in his residence. Over the years it was expanded to 20+ ranks including several MIDI ranks. Dr. Dapolito had the entire console restored with new keyboards. It was beautifully refinished in natural mahogany. A prototype S'andelco relay was installed and the console now had a capacity of 23+ ranks.



In 2020 after the passing of Dr. Dapolito, the console was put up for sale and when **Geoff Hansen** heard about it, he purchased it and put it on display in the lobby of **Hunter Hall** in Rio Vista. Geoff expanded it to handle 40 ranks and had plans to use it for a Hauptwerk project. Last fall, when Geoff heard about the failure of the combination action in the Sierra Chapter Morton console, he decided to donate his Wurlitzer console to us.

Dave Moreno is currently downsizing the console to match our instrument in the Fair Oaks Clubhouse and plans to add a few new ranks that will be installed in the future. The console portion of the Uniflex 5000 relay, that was also donated by **Geoff Hansen**, will be installed prior to transfer to Fair Oaks. The Z-tronics relay in our organ’s chambers will be replaced with the new Uniflex 5000 system.

Our Robert Morton 3 manual console, once owned by Buddy Cole, will be transferred to Hunter Hall so that Geoff can use it for his Hauptwerk project.
