The four-manual twenty-one rank theatre pipe organ at Grant Union High School was installed over a period of one year from 1938 to 1939. Pipe work and chests were obtained from theatre organs in Redding and San Francisco,

California, and Reno, Nevada. The best parts were used to assemble the organ by students under the direction of Fred Wood, an organ builder from Oakland. The new Grant organ was presented to the public in a recital by Emil Martin, Howard Scott, and George Wright on December 8, 1939.

Richard Hills was born in 1980 and, having shown an early interest in the organ, commenced piano studies at the age of six. Having

heard the Wurlitzer organ of the Thursford Collection in Norfolk, England at the age of seven, Richard became hooked on the sound of these instruments and began to study both theatre and classical organ with John Norris.

In 1994 Richard was awarded the Organ Scholarship at King's School in Rochester, England, and studied the classical organ at the Cathedral there with William Whitehead. Following this, Richard became the Organ Scholar of Exeter College at Oxford University where he studied the classical organ with David Sanger. Having completed his studies at Oxford, Richard spent a year as the Organ Scholar of Portsmouth Cathedral before being appointed to the Organ Scholarship of London's Westminster Abbey, where he performed regularly on the five-manual Harrison & Harrison organ and worked with the world-famous Abbey choir.

In 1995 at the age of 14, Richard was the over-all winner of the American Theatre Organ Society International Young Theatre Organist of the year competition in Detroit, Michigan. He returned to the United States the following year to perform at the 1996 ATOS convention in Pasadena. Since then, he has been a featured artist at five international ATOS conventions, giving his debut concert in 1998 at the Oakland Paramount Theatre in California at the age of 17.

In addition to these and other performances in the US, Richard has played throughout the British Isles, in Holland and Germany, and undertaken a four-week concert tour of Australia in August and September, 1999. He has appeared many times on national and international radio and TV and has several recording credits.

Richard left Westminster in September 2004 and is now pursuing a career as a freelance musician. In addition to his theatre and classical organ performances, Richard serves as Assistant Director of Music at St Mary's Bourne Street - a central London church in the Anglo-Catholic tradition.

His career in the theatre organ world has been equally prestigious. He has numerous prizes and awards to his credit, both in this country and in the USA, where he was named by 'Organist of the Year' in 2010 by the American Theatre Organ Society. He has appeared many times on national and international TV and Radio, including solo appearances on programs as diverse as Radio 3's *Choral Evensong* and Radio 2's *'Friday Night is Music Night*', and has several recording credits. His most recent solo recording was made on the magnificent dual-purpose Compton organ of Southampton's Guildhall.

When not on the bench, Richard continues to spend time furthering his interests in, amongst other things, Classic Cars and Organ Building. He has recently been appointed Musical Advisor to the UK's Cinema Organ Society in whose work he has taken an increasingly active role.

Richard is one of the very few musicians truly to have bridged and mastered the divide between the world of the classical organ and that of the theatre organ. His playing has generated a great deal of excitement both among ATOS audiences and his fellow artists. This is not a concert to miss.

Oroville State Theatre News

After a year of trying to operate the State Theatre without a theatre manager, the City of Oroville has entered into an agreement giving the daily operations of the State Theatre to the State Theatre Arts Guild (STAGE), the local non-profit theatre support group. Prior to this, STAGE's main purpose was to provide assistance in purchasing equipment and other theatre needs that the city was unable to fund. STAGE also has been in the process of assisting the Mt Shasta chapter ATOS in installing the Dale Mendenhall Memorial Wurlitzer TPO in the theatre. The Organ project had been put on hold during the "year of uncertainty" when the theatre's survival was a risk. Now that STAGE is booking and operating the theatre, the project has been reactivated; although STAGE's primary focus at this time is in getting the theatre itself operating smoothly.
